In some of the departments some specific kinds of innovative processes adopted are:

- Students are encouraged to take research based projects and publish their research papers in journals.
- Seminars and presentations are the integral part of continuous assessments evaluation system for the students of research oriented courses such as M.Tech. and M. Phil.
- To monitor the outcome mid-term tests are conducted and continuous assessments are given to evaluate the progress. The written tests for continuous assessment are centralized resulting in better objectivity of the evaluation system.
- Examination reforms are done as per Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) according to National higher education missions' guidelines.
- The conventional teaching is supplemented by seminars, assignment, writing, and the use of audio-visual study materials.
- To expose the UG students with the challenges of industrial environment, improve their personality traits and enhance their technical skills, the students are sent to various industries/R&D organizations for one complete semester (Project Semester) as a part of curriculum. During their project semester the students undertakes various industrial/research projects. To introduce and enhance the research potential of the PG students, the attempt is made to allot industry/R&D based real time problems during their dissertation work towards the final semester of M.Tech. Programme. Most of the PG students carry out their dissertation work in collaboration industries/R&D organizations.
- Seminars/Assignments/Court Visit/Extension lecture/Moot Court Competition/Tutorials are the part of the Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning.
- Scholarship to all the GATE qualified students through AICTE for the year 2015-16.
- Got 6 slots (2 regular/4 part-time) under VISVESVARAYA PhD scheme for Electronics & IT approved by the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) to enhance the number of PhDs in Electronic Design and Manufacturing (ESDM) and IT/IT Enabled Services (ITES) sector.
- Smart classrooms are created in some of the department to carry out the presentations by professors, students and thesis seminars.
- Department of Human Genetics has setup a centralized laboratory where advanced facilities are provided to the students for doing their Research Work and updated an already existing computer laboratory. A Wi-Fi enabled common research scholar laboratory has also been created, where research scholars are provided a platform to interact with each other to discuss scientific observations and achievements.
- Research projects for M.Sc. students, Industrial visits, Mandatory

- Industrial/Institutional training (4-6 weeks), recent teaching tools adopted.
- Teaching Methodology used by the Department of Theatre and Television is based on Lecturing, workshops, stage rehearsals and performances, film and TV viewing, Live/recorded Play viewing, hands on activities, creative writing and adaptation, improvisation, observation exercises, paper drawings, discourse/debate/group discussion, lecture review.
- Gurmat Gyan online Teaching Program run by Gurmat Gyan online Study
 Centre is completely online program, teaching through bi-lingual audio-visual

Women's Studies Centre

The Women's Studies Centre was allocated to Punjabi University by University Grants Commission under XI Plan, established under the able guidance and dynamic leadership Dr. Jaspal Singh, Vice-Chancellor, Punjabi University, Patiala. Its main objective is the pursuit of a comprehensive critical and balanced investigation of the cause of gender disparity. Youth is the prime focus of any nation to bring the attitudinal change in the society. Thus, there is a need to sensitize both young men and women as far as gender issues are concerned. It is the need of the hour to sensitize both the genders as one can't be a by-sider and other a participant but both should be equal partner to this process of change. They should be aware of their fundamentals rights and also need to understand moral and ethical aspects so as to coexist peacefully and with dignity. Keeping this thing in mind, the Women's Studies Centre has initiated Conference, Workshops, Celebration of International Days and Lectures Series on Gender Sensitization for the students of

various University Departments, Constituted Colleges, Affiliated Colleges and University Girls Hostels. In all these activities students will be sensitized about Self-Defence techniques, their constitutional and natural rights and will be guided to improve their pattern of thinking and behaviour. The Women's Studies Centre undertook the following activities during the academic year 2015-2016:

- 7th Annual International Conference on the theme "Empowering Women, Empowering Humanity" (Dec. 11-12, 2015)
- Enhancing Legal Efficacy Among Teachers (March 15-21, 2016)
- Learning Self-Defence Techniques for Girls (18th April to 22nd April, 2016)
- Celebration of International Women's Day 2016.
- Lectures Series on Gender Sensitization: During the session 2015-2016, the Centre organized Gender Sensitization lectures in various university departments(School of Management Studies, School of Applied Management and UCOE-Computer Science), colleges affiliated to Punjabi University (Government Bikram College of Commerce, Patiala, GN Girls College, Patiala, Multani Mal Modi College, Patiala and Mai Bhago Degree College for Girls, Ralla, Mansa) and colleges affiliated to other universities (Guru Nanak Dev University Campus, Amritsar, G.H.G. Khalsa College Gurusar Sadhar, Ludhiana, Gujranwala Guru Nanak Khalsa College, Ludhiana, Khalsa College for Women in Civil Lines, Ludhiana and Hindu Girls College Yamunanagar, Jagadhri).

Taking the social responsibility, the centre has adopted a village Akalgarh to develop it as a model village and organized FETE (16 February, 2016) for the upliftment of the society. The revenue generated from the FETE is used strictly for charitable purposes. Nukkard Plays were also organised to make the people aware of gender issues. The main objective of all activities was to make the participants understand the perceptions of the self and different stereotypes associated with men and women and analyse how these affect them.

- University Computer Centre is playing a pivotal role in developing in-house online admission platform. The centralised database repository

- is now being used by Hostels, Security Officer, Departments, I-card issuance, Main Library, etc. The overall objective is to enhance good governance characterised by transparency, accountability and simplicity.
- University Computer Centre is also taken as facilitator to provide roadmap for the computerisation of Examination Branch, Publication Bureau, Research Branch, Syndicate and Meeting Section, Establishment Branch, Accounts Branch, Post Metric Scholarship scheme for SC/BC students, Prevention of Women Harassment Cell, Anti-Executive Engineer etc.
- Managing mail server using free Google Apps Services for educational facilities. The facility is being used by Administration, Faculty Members and Research Scholars.
- Providing technical support to Chief Security Officer in up keeping of Surveillance System.
- Maintaining Wi-Fi hot spots in various administrative blocks and Library.
- Online Journals and online Library facilities (e-books, thesis, etc.)/repositories
 are accessible in the entire campus. Providing technical support for mapping of
 WEBOPAQ Server for outside access.
- University Computer Centre through its Director has been deputed as a nodal agency/nodal officer to promote Digital India Campaign, e-gazette uploading on Government Portal, E-waste management etc.
- Ph.D. registration/final viva are being conducted for offshore students as a regular feature.

In the Last five years, the University has undertaken several measures, which can be labelled as best practices in curricular aspects:

- Establishment of Neighbourhood Campuses at Bathinda, Talwandi Sabo, SAS Nagar, Malerkotla, Dehradoon, Jaito, Rampura Phul, Jhuneer, Karandi, Sardulgarh, Joga Ralla Dehla Seehan has been a unique innovation which is

done for the academic growth of the rural and economically poor sections of the society.

- A unique and innovative way of financing higher education has been introduced in Yadavindra College of Engineering, Talwandi Sabo and Engineering College, Rampura Phul. In these colleges rural students who are economically weaker are admitted and the expenditure of their studies is met through the donars from India and abroad.
- Most of the faculty has been trained in the use of computers, internet and audio visual aids.
- Modern educational technologies in teaching, such as multimedia teaching have been strengthened. Almost all the departments have been provided with computers and internet facilities.

Punjabi University has launch website (www.pupexamination.ac.in) for Cutlist/Internal/Practical online submission for regular students.

(a) Consultants for Quality Control

The Quality Control Consultant appointed for those work which expenditure amounting to more than Rs. 2.00 Crore. It is expected that every contractor will have proper quality control staff and procedures in order to ensure quality. They are also expected to impure their procedure in line and get the certification. The contractor shall engage a competent and independent quality control consultant approved by Engineering in charge of work to exercise effective control over the construction operate in the field so as to produce quality works. The fully equipped laboratory shall be set up at site of work and trained staff shall be employed by the said consultant.

Terms and Conditions: The contractor shall supply to the Engineer-in-Charge a copy of his agreement and the fee for quality should generally be between 0.5% and 1.5% at the contract value. The payment to the quality consultant shall be made by the Engineer-in-Charge direct as per the copy of the agreement supplied by the contractor. This payment will be recoverable from the contractor. The Consultant will guide the contractor for production of quality

works at all stages and shall maintain records. Reports and test results so as to indicate the extent quality to Engineer-in-Charge regularly. The contractor shall also attach a copy of these reports, tests and check with his bill without which no payment shall be made. The Engineer-in-Charge can also order the change of consultant if in his opinion they are not performing competently. The Engineer-in-Charge will be free to conduct surprise, random or in situ checks so as to have cross check on quality control consultant, the Engineer-in-Charge may order employment of a consultant at the cost of the contractor or may order the department staff or carry out the quality control checks and a deduction at the rate of 1.5% of the total cost of the work shall be deducted from the bill of the contractor even if the actual expenditure incurred on private consultant or department quality control is less, Nothing in this clause shall reduce the overall responsibility of the contractor quality and he shall remain liable for any defect in the execution.

(b) Performance Test

The contractor shall give a satisfactory performance test of the entire installation as per standard specifications before work is finally accepted and nothing extra whatsoever shall be payable to the contractor for this test.

 prognostic and preventive modalities to lessen the disease burden in this part of the
 region.
